Pinery offers curriculum linked programs that connect students with nature. Pre-and post-program activities are available upon request. If you have a specific interest, we are eager to tailor a program to your needs.



Turtle Talk: Learn about the turtles that call Pinery Provincial Park home and meet three LIVE turtle ambassadors! (all ages)



Pinery's changing seasons: Learn about the strategies that animals use to survive seasonal changes. Programs are focused on the current season. (Grades K-2)

Fall into Pinery: Investigate wildlife busy preparing for winter.

Pinery on Pause: Learn how animals survive harsh winter conditions.

Spring into Pinery: Look for signs of wildlife springing back into action.



The Disappearing Butterfly: Explore food web connections and the role humans play in our ecosystems to solve the mystery of the disappearing butterfly. (Grades 4-7)



Nocturnal Hunters: Uncover owls and their amazing adaptations. (Grades K-5)



Fur and Scales: Investigate differences between the six major animal groups or choose your favourite to focus on. (Grades K-6)



Wonderful Wetlands: Investigate aquatic life hands on to learn about biodiversity and ecosystem health. (All ages)



Species on the Brink: A look into the lives of Species at Risk. (All ages)



Dynamic Dunes: Witness the resilience of sand dunes in the face of constant change. (Grades 7-12)



Oak Savanna Expedition: Explore first-hand this rare mosaic of deciduous forest and prairie grassland (Grades 2 – 6)



Ontario Parks Giant Floor Map: Learn about the geography of Ontario while moving around on a giant map of the province (All ages)
